The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) statutory framework is a government document that all schools in England must follow. It sets standards for the learning, development, and care of your child from birth to 5 years old. The standards ensure your child will learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe.

The EYFS framework consists of seven areas of learning and development. There are three prime areas of learning, which lay the foundations for children's success in all other areas of learning and of




- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development

There are four specific areas of learning, through which the prime areas are strengthened and applied:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

- Summative assessments at key points see assessment policy.








